Which is Worse?! (1 Hour)

Patients arrive at the Doctor's office with a number of eye concerns – and one question: "Which is Worse?" In order to perform the appropriate exam for the doctor, the technician needs to have a working knowledge of these diseases, so we can ask the right questions and perform the right exam. We will discuss the anatomical differences between a number Fuch's vs Bullous Keratopathy and OHTN vs POAG. We will discuss the complaints the patient may present with as well as the correct exam to provide for the doctor to do their examination of the patient.

When patients calls, or walks, into the clinic with an eye problem, there are certain phrases, or descriptions, they use that cause us to determine that a patient should be seen sooner than later: "buzz words". So....what are some of the common buzz words or phrases and when should we schedule these appointments to ensure they are seen in the appropriate time frame for their complaint?

Basic Anatomy of the Eye (1 Hour)

This course will review the anatomy of the eye from the cornea all the way to the optic nerve. We will also discuss various eye diseases/syndromes that can affect each area as well as certain medical diseases that affect these areas of the eye.

Performing Thorough & Reliable Visual Fields (1 Hour)

It is not enough to be able to "do" a visual field – you must be able to do thorough, consistent and reliable visual fields. We will discuss: parameters of a visual field, the settings of the HVF (blind spot monitor, spot size, how to adjust and use the appropriate correction) as well as discuss False Positives and False Negatives, Grey Scale and the different types of HVF available (24-2, Sita, Sita Fast). We also will discuss the Prechiasm, Chiasm and Postchiasm and how to "anticipate" what visual field defects we may see when performing visual fields. Understanding the "parts" of the visual fields will ensure that our fields are reliable for the doctor's exam and the patient's care!

"Why Do You Ask?" (1 Hour)

Any Medical Staff doing patient intake History taking is probably one of the most important "skills" – and hardest – that we perform as technical staff. Asking the right question should lead you to the right answer – which is: what do I do for this patient?! Sad to say... it is also an area that techs tend to skim over during the exam. Refocusing on the importance of histories will lead you to the answers your doctor needs.
